The following records are from an old notebook of the late Rebecca M Wilson; she was a great-granddaughter of William and Jane (McColloch) Bonar. Her records are important because they list the surnames of the daughters' consorts. Although we are aware of the consort's surnames, we have not been able to document all of these early marriage records. See pages 59-75, Generation Three, for the records of the children of William and Jane Bonar.

Rebecca M Wilson also gives the names of the children of Robert and Ann (Hyatt) McIntire, whose daughter Rebecca married Greenbury Dorsey Bonar.

Divorce Records are not listed in the Bonar Genealogy. Court records of divorces are not generally public like other records such as vital statistics, wills, deeds, estate settlements, etc.

WILL (Refers to John Bonar, Line 48, Page 470 and Line 53, Page 477, a son of Barnet Bonar II)

In the name of God Amen!!! I John Bonar of Morris Township, Knox County, Ohio do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament.

First: I desire that all my just debts be paid, and that my Executors erect at my grave a suitable grave stone.

Secondly: I bequeath unto my beloved wife the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars a year during her natural life time, to be paid her as hereinafter directed, also any articles of my personal Estate that she may desire, to be selected by herself.

Thirdly: I direct that in case my Estate not herein specifically devised, shall be insufficient to pay my debts, that my three children JOSIAH BONAR, CATHARINE LEONARD and ISABEL BONAR contribute their equal proportions, of any sum that may be found necessary by my Executors to pay the same.

Fourthly: I hereby devise and bequeath unto my daughter Catharine Leonard the sum of Seven Hundred dollars in addition to the Eighteen Hundred dollars heretofore paid, to be paid to her by my Executors out of my Estate.

Fifthly: I hereby devise and bequeath unto my daughter Isabel Bonar all of my homestead farm on which I now reside situated in Morris Township and County and State aforesaid, with all the appurtenances, to be unto her \_\_\_ Estate of inheritance in fee simple, and to her heirs forever, Provided however that she shall be held and bound to pay the sum of One Thousand \_\_\_\_\_ dollars as follows: (to wit) The sum of one hundred and fifty dollars a year unto my wife during her natural lifetime, and also to pay all of the taxes that may be assessed against the whole of my said homestead farm thus bequeather, that shall occur during the lifetime of my wife, Seventy five dollars a year of which payments thus required to be paid annually by my said daughter Isabel shall stand as a credit to her and apply as a payment on the sum of one thousand dollars which she is hereby required to pay as aforesaid.

Sixthly: I hereby direct that in the event of the death of my wife before the sum of one thousand \_\_\_\_\_ dollars to be paid by my said daughter Isabel, shall have been fully cancelled as paid by the application of the annual sum of the Seventy five dollars as above directed, that in that event the balance thus found due and unpaid by my said daughter shall be by her paid as follows - First the amount that shall have been advanced by the several heirs to pay debts, if any amt shall have been advanced as specified in the third Item of this will. Shall be paid back with interest from the time said advancement was made. 2nd I direct that one hundred dollars, if so much shall still remain unpaid, be paid to "American Reform tract Book Society" located at Cincinnati Ohio and the balance if any shall remain, to be divided equally between my son Josiah and my daughter Catherine Leonard or their heirs. Seventhly; I also direct further that in addition to the amount bequeathed to my wife that shall have the use of any room she may wish, in my homestead house, and the right to firewood on the farm during her life time.

Eighthly: I direct that all my Estate both real and personal not herein otherwise disposed of be sold by my Executors and the proceeds applied to the payment of my debts, and the balance left, if any, distributed amongst my three children equally.

Ninthly: I hereby devise and bequeath unto my son Josiah Bonar all of that farm on which he now resides and I direct my Executors to deliver unto him the deed for the same which has been by me executed upon his executing to them his promisory note for the sum of five hundred dollars payable in two years - from my death.

Tenthly: I direct that in addition to the hereinabove bequeathed to my daughter Isabel, my Executors pay to her in money any amount she may need during the first year after my death, not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Eleventh: I hereby nominate and appoint Archibald Greenlee my Executor of this my last will and testament, hereby authorizing and empowering him to collect my debts and receipt for the same, and to sell either at public or private sale, either with or without appraisal, and on such terms and payments as he may judge best all of my Estate both real and personal and to Execute deeds to purchasers for the same in fee simple, and to release and discharge, and as all other things needful in order fully to carry out the foregoing provisions of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of December AD 1859.
