"Genealogy of the Hendershot Family in America 1710-1960" published by Al Hendershot, Akron, Ohio, gives this lineage for Hendershot families in Belmont and Monroe Counties, Ohio. (Some Hendershot families known by me to be descendants are not listed in this Genealogy.--DRB) Thomas Hendershot, early pioneer to Belmont County, the great grandfather of Katherine (Schultz) Rine, is not listed in that Genealogy although he lived near to and in same York Township as other Hendershot families that are listed. There is considerable evidence that the first six generations of Hendershots as listed below are probably the ancestors of Thomas Hendershot. The estate settlement and sale bill for Thomas Hendershot are in Envelope (Case #2928), Belmont County, Ohio, Court Records, in the Courthouse, St. Clairsville, Ohio.
